## Remembering Her Journey

Sallie Sue Pattillo Carter, daughter of the late Elder Benjamin and Missionary Ethel Green Pattillo was born on October 21, 1930 in Carthage, Arkansas. She completed her earthly journey Saturday, March 22, 2025, at CHI St. Vincent Hospital in Hot Springs, Arkansas. Her passing is a deep and personal loss to her family and friends. Admiration, affection and respect for her will continue to live in their hearts.

Mother Sallie Sue Pattillo Carter spent her formative years in Carthage. She graduated from Carthage High School and Philander Smith College (now Philander Smith University.) She did further study at Arkansas Agricultural, Mechanical, and Normal College (now University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff), Henderson State University, and Ouachita Baptist University. She helped to mold many lives during the fifty (50) years she spent in the field of education.

Mother Carter generously gave her full support to various programs, projects and ministries. She loved the Lord and was a faithful, dedicated member of Pattillo Memorial Church Of God In Christ where she served as Pianist, Sunday School Teacher, Home and Foreign Mission President, Bible Band Secretary, and many times provided janitorial services.

Samuel Sanders so eloquently said, "No good thing is ever lost. Nothing dies, not even life which gives up one form to resume another. No good action, no good deed, no good example dies. It lives forever in the race of humankind. While the frame disappears, the deeds leave an indelible stamp and mold the very thought and will of future generations." So, it was with the life of Mother Sallie Sue Pattillo Carter. In the community, she was a member of the Carthage Reunion Committee. In the local church, she worked with the Sunshine Band and Youth. She would carry them to the meetings in Hot Springs, Camden and any other place where there was a meeting. On the District level, she served as the YPWW Chairlady and later was elevated to District Missionary. She carried out her duties as unto the Lord. Later she became the Jurisdictional YPWW Chairlady and would travel to the InternationalUNAC (later AIM) Conventions to increase her knowledge of the Youth Department. She also traveled extensively to the International Women's Convention/Crusades. She even attended the first inauguration of President William Jefferson Clinton in Washington, DC. Mother Carter's last appointment was that of the Chairperson of the Finance Committee for the Jurisdictional Department of Women Ministries.

Those who cherish and celebrate her legacy include four children: Juanita Quick (Fredrick), Little Rock, AR; Pamela Carter Harrison, Scottsdale, AZ; James Carter, Colorado Springs, CO; and Andrew Carter, Carthage, AR.; five grandchildren; four great grandchildren; one sister, Francis White, Milwaukee, WI; many nieces, nephews, former students, Pattillo Memorial, Rison Fellowship District, and a multitude of friends from acrossArkansas Second Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction.
